Guidelines for Your Senior Internship Poster


- Poster board should be foam board (20" x 30").
 - Pick a neutral color, white, **black** or **gray**.
- **Graphics** will help make your poster visually interesting.
 - horizontal graphics = restful vertical = energy.
 - Remember the liability issues of photographing people! Backs are best!
- **4** Text:
 - Use at least. 36 point for the poster's title.
 - 24 point font for your name and other headings.
 - Avoid fonts that are *difficult* to read.
 - Use upper and lower case.
 - The same typeface should be used throughout your poster.

AVOID HAND LETTERING. If you must, use a black felt-tip pen (Sharpie) and use a ruler and/or stencils.

- **Color** use sparingly, only for highlighting important points.
- Use **double-sided tape** to attach all components of your poster.
- **Be concise**. Save elaboration for your verbal presentation.
- All words should be spelled out, **no abbreviations**.

Plan it out!

Make a sketch to plan out of the layout of your poster. Think about arranging the contents in a series of 3 or 4 columns.



- The title should appear across the top.
- A brief introduction (3 5 sentences) should go in the upper left.
- The conclusions should appear at the end in the lower right.
- Methods and Results should fill the remaining space.
